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Preparing for Your Mohs Skin Surgery

Please do not make any plans or appointments during the day of surgery. You may be in the office anywhere from 2 to 6 hours. AFTER SURGERY. There will be post-operative follow-up. It is best to remain in the local area (if possible) for 10 – 14 days after the procedure. LET THE DOCTOR KNOW IF YOU CANNOT DO THIS.

The night before and the morning of surgery:

- Don't have ALCOHOL (wine, beer, liquor) from one week <u>before</u> until one week <u>after surgery</u>.
- Eat a regular breakfast the morning of the surgery and shower and shampoo.

What to wear:

- Old shirt with buttons (not a pullover). Warm socks and multiple layers
- Do not wear jewelry. If you are having facial surgery, do not wear make up

What to bring:

- BRING ALL your medications in their bottle to show the doctor.
- Bring a snack to eat.
- You MUST have a person to drive you from the doctor's office after the person. One person may keep you company in the reception area or we can call you a ride to pick up one half hour before you are ready to leave.

MEDICATIONS

- TAKE ALL your prescribed medications unless your doctor tells you not to.
- STOP all herbs, vitamin E, niacin, multivitamins or non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medicines (Motrin, Aleve, Advil, Bufferin, Naproxen,etc). These can all cause bleeding.
- If you have a history of ARTIFICIAL HEART VALVES, JOINT REPLACEMENT or ENDOCARDITIS, you should check with your Primary Care Physician about taking antibiotics before the procedure.

ASPIRIN AND BLOOD-THINNERS:

If your doctor has prescribed Aspirin for your heart, TAKE THE ASPIRIN AS YOUR DOCTOR SUGGESTED UNLESS YOUR DOCTOR GIVES YOU PERMISSION TO STOP ASPIRIN 2 WEEKS BEFORE SURGERY.

If your doctor has prescribed Aspirin for "prevention", PLEASE ASK YOUR DOCTOR IF YOU CAN STOP ASPIRIN AT LEAST 2 WEEKS BEFORE SURGERY.

If your doctor has prescribed Coumadin, Warfarin, Plavix, Lovenox or other anti-coagulants, PLEASE CONTINUE THESE MEDICATIONS BEFORE SURGERY. If you take Coumadin, please send your last INR lab check.
